ABOUT THIS QUALIFICATION

The Eduqas Level 1/2 Engineering Vocational Award provides learners with a comprehensive introduction to this vital and fast-growing sector.

Why study Engineering?

Engineering is a driving force in the UK economy, employing over 6.3 million people – equivalent to almost 1 in 5 jobs. Engineering and technology sector jobs are predicted to grow rapidly by 2030, increasing demand for skilled workers.

This qualification will provide learners with a grounding in an essential sector that offers opportunities in a wide variety of disciplines such as aerospace, environmental engineering, mechanical engineering, product development and manufacturing.

Learners will develop an understanding of engineering principles and build their skills and knowledge in key areas including engineering advances, materials, processes, technical drawing and machining, as well as transferrable skills such as problem solving and communicating ideas.

Who is the qualification suitable for?

Our Level 1/2 Engineering Vocational Award has been designed as a vocational alternative or supplement to GCSE qualifications for 14-16 year old learners in schools and colleges.

It offers a structured pathway to understanding the diverse career opportunities in Engineering, and provides a foundation for further study that in turn would support learners' progression to employment within the sector.

WHAT DOES THE QUALIFICATION COVER?

The qualification consists of three units:

Unit 1: Manufacturing Engineering Products

(48 Guided Learning Hours). In Unit 1 learners will:

- Interpret different types of engineering information to plan how to produce engineering products.
- Develop knowledge, understanding and skills in using engineering tools and equipment to produce and test an end product.

Unit 2: Designing Engineering Products

(24 Guided Learning Hours). In Unit 2 learners will:

- Explore how an engineered product is adapted and improved over time, and to apply their knowledge and understanding to adapt an existing component, element or part of the engineering outcome that they produced for Unit 1.

Unit 3: Solving Engineering Problems

(48 Guided Learning Hours). In Unit 3 learners will:

- Learn a range of considerations that impact on engineering design and how modern engineering has had an impact on modern day life at home, work and in society in general.



SUMMARY OF ASSESSMENT

Unit 1: Manufacturing Engineering Products

Written Examination: 20 hours, 40% of qualification (80 marks)

An assignment brief will be provided by Eduqas, including a scenario and several tasks. These will be available via the WJEC/Eduqas Portal.

Unit 2: Designing Engineering Products

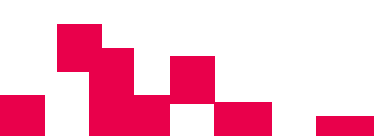
Controlled Assessment: 10 hours, 20% of qualification (40 marks)

An assignment brief will be provided by Eduqas, including a scenario and several tasks. These will be available via the WJEC/Eduqas Portal.

Unit 3: Solving Engineering Problems

Written Assessment: 1 hour 30 minutes, 40% of qualification (80 marks)

Questions requiring objective responses, short and extended answers, based around applied situations. Learners will be required to use stimulus material to respond to questions



Assessment Objectives

Learners must:

- AO1: Demonstrate knowledge and understanding from across the specification
- AO2: Apply skills (including practical skills), knowledge and understanding in a variety of contexts and in planning and carrying out investigations and tasks.
- AO3: Analyse and evaluate information, making reasoned judgements and presenting conclusions.

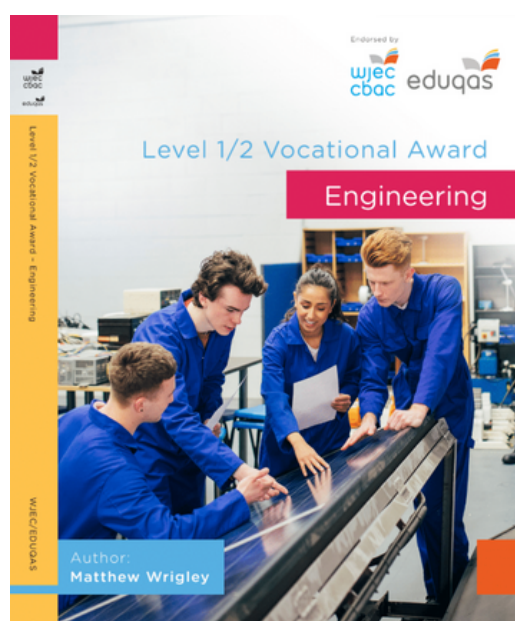
COURSE COMPANION TEXTBOOK
