AREAS OF STRENGTHS OF THE 2019 SUMMER ASSESSMENT

Following a review of the summer assessment, our GCSE English Language Team and examiners have identified that candidates generally performed well in the following areas:

- Supporting opinions when evaluating a text/extract
- Efficient use of textual support with embedded short quotations
- Selecting and synthesising relevant information from two texts
- Sharper focus on narrative titles
- Using tone effectively to engage the reader across all writing tasks

AREAS FOR ADDITIONAL SUPPORT

Our GCSE English Language team and examiners felt that, following the performance in the recent assessment, candidates found the following areas particularly challenging:

- Developing a coherent stance when evaluating a text/extract
- Time management, especially the Reading section of Component 2
- Comparison of the writers' style in Component 2
- Consistency of tenses in narrative writing
- Using a range of appropriate and well selected details to support points in transactional writing



ENHANCING THE DELIVERY OF GCSE ENGLISH LANGUAGE FOR 2019/20

Based on the performance of candidates in the 2019 summer assessment, the following areas have been identified as potential areas for teachers to consider providing additional support to their candidates:

- Tracking the text/extract to develop a range of points
- Avoiding feature spotting or searching for devices as the starting point of a response
- Linking comments and inferences to textual evidence
- Checking the exact focus of each question before candidates write their responses
- Taking a coherent stance when responding to the evaluation questions
- Using the bullet points in the Component 2 comparison question to structure a response
- Time management, including leaving enough time to proofread writing responses
- Tense control in narrative writing
- Developing ideas/opinions with sufficient detail in transactional writing
- Strategies for improving technical accuracy, especially punctuation.
