Think about how individuals' care needs can be best met and how core values can be assured in different situations.

Think about factors that can cause changes to the needs of individuals.

Try and engage with the sector: visits, work placements, listening to speakers, online webinars, etc.

Watch health and social care related programmes online and/or on TV to research and explore the topics you will cover in class.

Develop analytical skills at every opportunity.

HOW ARE YOU ASSESSED?

The WJEC Level 3 Certificate and Diploma in Health and Social Care is assessed using a combination of internal and external assessment.

Certificate

Unit 1: (Contemporary) Issues in Health and Social Care

There will be a written examination in June each year to assess your knowledge and understanding of what you have been taught.

Unit 2: Core Values and Services

You will need to complete a non-examination assessment (NEA) based on a set scenario.

You will need to respond to four tasks, completed under controlled conditions, within a 10-hour timeframe.

Written evidence will be required to show where you have covered the assessment criteria.

Diploma

Units 1 and 2 as above - plus:

EITHER:

Unit 3: Explain how services and practitioners meet individual needs

You will need to complete a non-examination assessment (NEA) based on a set brief.

You will need to respond to two tasks, completed under controlled conditions, within a 15-hour timeframe.

Written evidence will be required to show where you have covered the assessment criteria.

OR: Unit 4: Experience of Disease, Illness and Disability

You will need to complete a non-examination assessment (NEA) based on a set brief.

You will need to respond to two tasks, completed under controlled conditions, within a 15-hour timeframe.

Written evidence will be required to show where you have covered the assessment criteria.

PLUS

Unit 5: Human Behaviour and Development

There will be a written examination in June each year to assess your knowledge and understanding of what you have been taught.
