Component 2 has changed into three papers. Two of the three papers must be chosen	
Component 1	Duration 2 hours – no change 80 marks available – no change Section A: Shakespeare (40 marks) – no change Section B: Post-1914 Prose/Drama (40 marks) - moved from Component 2 and replacing the Poetry Anthology question. Weighting increased from 40% to 50%. Each question carries 40 marks and is worth 25% of the qualification.
Component 2	Duration reduced from 2 hours 30 minutes to 2 hours 80 marks available a change from 120 previously Weighting decreases from 60% to 50%. Each question carries 40 marks and is worth 25% of the qualification. Candidates sit two of the three available options. The paper will be split into three one-hour papers. Centres will indicate their options through entries. Option 1: Poetry Anthology (40 marks) *moved from Component 1. Option 2: 19th Century Prose (40 marks) – no change Option 3: Unseen Poetry (40 marks) – no change

GCSE Geography	
Geography A Component 3	The examination paper (Component 3) will not have questions asking about candidates' own fieldwork in Part A and Part B. The total mark changes from 76 to 64.
Geography B Component 3	The examination paper (Component 3) will not have questions asking about candidates' own fieldwork in Part A and Part B. The total mark changes from 76 to 64.

GCSE History

Students complete three out of four equally weighted papers, as follows: Non-British Depth Study (compulsory for all) and any two out of three of the following:

- · British Depth Study, and/or
- Period Study, and/or
- Thematic Study with Historic Environment

Spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPaG) will be assessed in the compulsory Non-British Depth Study paper only, with a maximum mark for SPaG increased from 3 to 5 in this paper.

Mark changes are shown below.

Note – the Non-British Depth Study is compulsory with any other two of three papers
