2. SET PRODUCT CHANGES

A LEVEL

Due to the closure of *gal-dem*, there is a set product change for A Level Media Studies Component 2, Section C: Media in the Online Age.

gal-dem has been replaced by *Thiiird* (https://www.thiiirdmagazine.co.uk/) for first assessment in 2025.

In assessment in 2025, candidates will be permitted to refer to either *gal-dem* or *Thiiird* as a set product in Group 2. *gal-dem* will no longer be accepted as a set product in assessment from 2026 onwards.

GCSE

We have exciting new set products changes in the GCSE Specification for first assessment in 2027 (first teaching in 2025).

The changes to the GCSE specification are:

- In Component 1 Section A, This Girl Can (2015) is replaced by NHS 111 (2023).
- In Component 1 Section B, *The Archers* is replaced by <u>Desert Island Discs</u>.
- In Component 2 Section A, *Luther* (Series 1, episode 1, 2010, cert. 15) is replaced by *Trigger Point* (Series 2, Episode 1, 2024, cert. 15).

3. NON-EXAM ASSESSMENT



NEA BRIEFS

The NEA briefs for GCSE and A Level (for assessment in 2025) were released on 1 March 2024.

The NEA briefs for AS (for assessment in 2025) were released on 1 September 2024.

The NEA briefs for GCSE and A Level (for assessment in 2026) were released on 1 March 2025.

The NEA briefs for AS (for assessment in 2026) will be released on 1 September 2025.

We regret to inform you of two small errors in our A Level and GCSE Media Studies NEA briefs released on March 1st 2025 on WJEC Portal.

GCSE Media Studies Component 3 NEA brief - Notes for Guidance - Brief 2 Magazines, page 16

A third bullet point referring to an editor's letter should not have been included in the guidance. There is no requirement for candidates to produce an editor's letter. The GCSE briefs were corrected and re-uploaded to Portal on 3rd March 2025.

A level Media Studies Component 3 NEA brief - Notes for Guidance - Brief 3 Film Marketing, page 31

The brief requires candidates to produce a one-page feature article. Bullet point 3 of the Notes for Guidance referred to a double-page. The reference to the double-page was incorrect as the requirement is for a one-page feature article.

The A Level briefs were corrected and re-uploaded to Portal on 4th March 2025.

We request that you discard any versions viewed/downloaded on or before the briefs were re-uploaded.

The NEA briefs are available on the <u>Portal</u> (the secure website). Please see our <u>NEA briefs guide</u> for details on how to find the NEA briefs. Teachers are reminded that the briefs change every year, and of the importance of completing the correct brief for the year of assessment.

The Principal Moderators for GCSE and A Level qualifications have produced video walkthrough of the GCSE and A Level NEA Briefs and accompanying Notes for Guidance. These can be found on Portal (the secure website) under 'Training and Guidance'.

Teachers will need a **username and password** to access <u>Portal</u> which is provided by their **Exams Officer**, and **permissions for all areas of the site** to access the briefs.

COVERSHEETS

Please note that revised versions of the coversheets were released in March 2024, and these **must** be used for assessment in 2025.

The coversheets have been revised to include:

- a statement about the use of AI in the candidate and teacher/assessor declaration
- a reminder that candidates who do not submit a production must be awarded zero marks for the Statement of Aims.

Coversheets are now available in PDF and Word format. The PDF format has been designed to support teachers and candidates to complete and submit the coversheets easily and accurately. We recommend using a fully featured PDF reader, such as Adobe Acrobat, to complete the form.



SUBMISSION

Please note that the deadlines for submission of Non-Exam Assessment (NEA) for assessment are:

- GCSE 5th May
- AS and A Level 15th May

These dates are set, and do not change from year to year.

The GCSE deadline year falls on a Bank Holiday this year, therefore inputting marks a week prior to the 5th May deadline is highly recommended.

Media Studies NEA marks will be uploaded onto our Internal Assessment Mark Input System (IAMIS) on <u>Portal</u> (the secure website). From summer 2025, Media Studies NEA samples, which were previously uploaded via Surpass, must also be uploaded via IAMIS on <u>Portal</u> (the secure website). This means that keycodes are no longer required. Please be aware that centres will need to factor in the time needed to upload the sample folders after the sample has been generated, and therefore we do recommend that marks be uploaded a week before the upload deadline.

If you are responsible for entering marks and uploading work on IAMIS, please ensure you have an account on <u>Portal</u>. Your Exams Officer will set you up with this account.

Please ensure when uploading work that all candidate declaration forms have been signed by **both** the candidate and the teacher prior to uploading.
