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1. Summer 2025 Results

GCSE results in English Language were published on August 21st 2025. The papers and mark schemes from the summer 2025 series are now available to view on [Portal](#). If you do not have access, please contact your exams officer.

As in previous series, a free access to scripts service is available for Eduqas GCSE English Language (C700U10-1 and C700U20-1). Centres can download scripts on behalf of candidates via Portal allowing you to:

- find out how your learners performed in specific areas of assessment.
- better understand how examiners apply our mark schemes.
- gain insights through the comments of our trained examiners.
- identify areas where learners need additional support for future assessments.

Remember that 25th September is the last date for access to post results services such as a review of marking. Please see our [website](#) for more details. Please note that a centre must obtain the candidate's permission prior to applying for a review of marking.

You can find a range of helpful information in our [Guide to Summer 2025 Post-Results Services](#). Applications for an appeal must be submitted within 30 calendar days of WJEC issuing the outcome of a review of marking. Any applications or requests received after this date will not be accepted.

2. Analysing Candidates' Results

WJEC Eduqas offers two services to help you understand your students' results and develop their exam skills: Exam Results Analysis and standardised candidate exemplars..

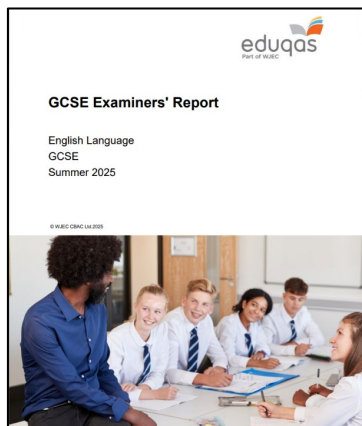

6. GCSE English Language NEA (November 2025 series)

Spoken Language Statement

Centres that are entering new grades in the November 2025 series are required to send a signed spoken language statement to us confirming that reasonable steps have been taken to ensure that all candidates entered for WJEC Eduqas GCSE English Language have completed the Spoken Language assessment. **The statement must be signed by the Head of Centre.**

The completed statement must be emailed to spokenlanguagestatement@eduqas.co.uk by the 5th November 2025.

Please note that the declaration does not need to be completed if all candidates in your centre are carrying forward their spoken language grade from a previous series.

Submission of audio-visual samples

Upload to WEC Portal

Where centres have new work to submit, complete and unedited samples should be uploaded to our internal assessment mark input system (IAMIS). Information on how to do this can be found [here](#) and a video which takes you through the process can be found [here](#).

Check that the recordings are accessible and audible before uploading. One file should be submitted per candidate.

The file name for each individual recording must contain the following information:

component code
centre number
candidate number
candidate name (forename and surname)
proposed grade (Pass, Merit, Distinction, Not Classified)
e.g. C700U30-1 _12345_0001_Jones M_Pass

A separate file should be created for each candidate. The preferred format for saving recordings of the candidates' presentations is mp4 as it is the most widely supported format across media players.

Where centres are entering new work in November, Spoken Language standardised exemplars and commentaries are available on [Portal](#) to support teachers standardising the marking of the NEA presentations. They can be located by selecting 'Subject-Specific Support Material including CPD and Exemplars' on the 'Resources' tab and then entering 'spoken language' in the search box. Remember to select the Eduqas brand in the 'Options' filters.

Blended Learning Resources

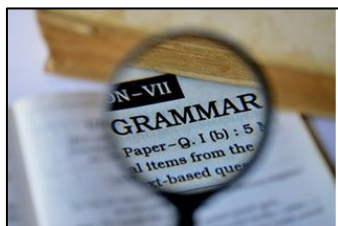

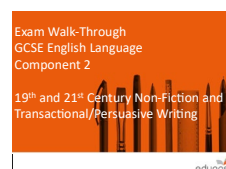
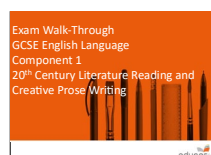

Exam walk-throughs – GCSE English Language

Exam walk-throughs are available for both GCSE English Language components.

These are student-friendly resources that offer practical hints and tips on how to effectively approach questions in the examination papers. Using questions from past exam papers, the PPT with audio help and audio script in the notes will walk students through a mock examination paper, helping them revise and practise useful exam techniques. They can complete the “mock” in a single sitting, tackle one or two questions at a time or revisit some parts of the presentation to reinforce their learning.

Did you know that we have a Regional Support Team who can offer you any support which you may need?

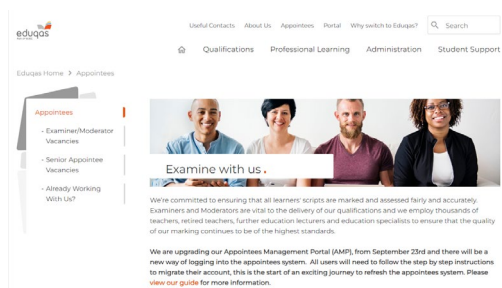
This includes:

12. Become an Examiner

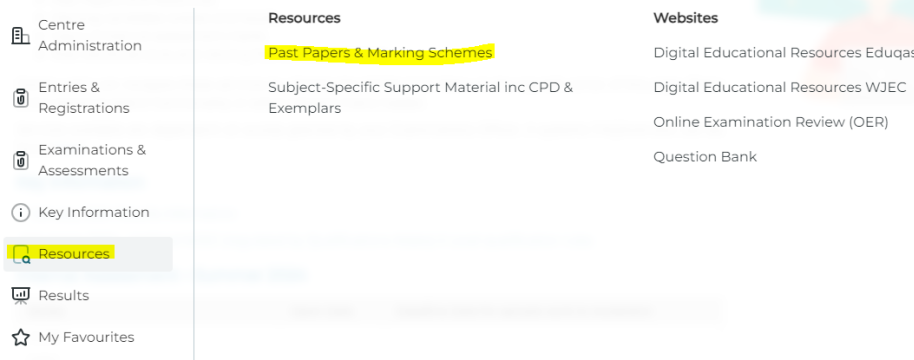


As the entry for Eduqas GCSE English Language continues to grow, we are keen to appoint new examiners for summer 2026.


