One question from a choice of two based on the reading of a pair of plays: one pre-1900 and one post-1900, from a prescribed list:  Christopher Marlowe: Doctor Faustus (Longman) & Lucy Prebble: Enron (Methuen)  OR John Webster: The Duchess of Malfi (Methuen) & Tennessee Williams: A Streetcar Named Desire (Penguin Modern Classics)  OR Thomas Middleton: The Revenger's Tragedy (Methuen) & Joe Orton: Loot (Methuen)

Component 3: Unseen texts	Written examination: 2 hours - 20% of qualification
Section A: Unseen prose	Section B: Unseen poetry
One question from a choice of two, analysing an unseen passage of prose, taken from one of two prescribed periods for study	One question from a choice of two, analysing an unseen poem or poetry extract
Component 4: Prose study	Non-exam assessment - 20% of qualification

One 2500-3500 word assignment based on the reading of two prose texts from different periods, one pre-2000 and one post- 2000, nominated by the centre.
