

Supporting Teacher Assessed Grades for Eduqas

GCSE French, German and Spanish qualifications

To help teachers determine grades for their GCSE Modern Foreign Languages students this summer, we thought it may be useful to explain all the materials that Eduqas has made available to centres.

Please find below a catalogue of the materials, with descriptions and explanations, to help you with your grading decisions for Eduqas GCSE Modern Foreign Languages qualifications. Speaking Endorsement summer 2021	Please note that Component 1 (Speaking) takes the form of an endorsement in summer 2021. In November 2020, Ofqual published the criteria for the levels of attainment of Pass, Merit and Distinction which can be found in Table 1 on pages 20 and 21 of the document: GCSE Subject Level conditions and requirements for Modern Foreign languages and certificate requirements (2021). Assessment Resources	These are sets of questions arranged by skill; each one is numbered for reference. Use of our assessment resources is not compulsory, but they could form part of the range of evidence teachers could use to determine grades. They are taken mainly from past papers with some material from the A20 series that could be new to students. These have been designed largely to be taken in one lesson, across two in a minority of cases to preserve the integrity and validity of the assessment. Teachers are not expected to use every Assessment Resource for the qualification. We are required by DfE and Ofqual to house these materials on our public website. The purpose of providing marked candidate work is to exemplify the standards and how to apply the mark scheme or assessment grid for our qualifications. Grade Boundary Information	Grade boundaries from past examination series are available on the subject webpages. Component boundaries are 'notional' and intended only as a guide to aid centres and are not official grades. Grading Exemplar	These exemplar materials are provided to centres to support teachers when making holistic judgements about student performance and should be used in conjunction with the grade descriptors. The exemplification reflects the standard set in a summer series where examinations took place. A commentary is provided to aid understanding of the characteristics of the work at component level as well as for the overall grade awarded.	WJEC secure website
Grade Descriptors	This link takes you to the JCQ webpage which provides a wealth of support materials to help with the administration of summer 2021 assessments across all exam boards. You will also find here an assessment record template and a Head of Department checklist. The grade descriptors will help identify how the range of evidence for a student aligns with the expected performance standards.	JCQ website
Historic Attainment Data	This link takes you to the item level data from previous Eduqas examination series. The data provides a detailed analysis of the performance of candidates on each item (question or part question) that can be used for comparing performance. If you are using Eduqas assessment resources to generate evidence as part of your grading decisions, this information can be helpful in comparison of your students' outcomes with those who sat the examination from which the assessment resource material has been taken. Please be aware that we have not provided access to Autumn 2020 data as it aligns to summer 2020 standards rather than previous series and therefore should be treated with caution.	WJEC secure website
