Summer 2022 Grading

Ofqual has confirmed that grading will be more generous this summer than when exams were last taken in summer 2019.

Result Days

Your school or college will issue your results on:



Thursday August 18

AS/A levels and Level 3 Qualifications



Thursday August 25

GCSE and Level 1/2 Qualifications

Your school or college will let you know how you can collect your results.



Grade Boundaries

Grade boundaries are the minimum number of marks you need to achieve each grade. As exams are different each year, so are the grade boundaries.

You can access the grade boundaries for your qualifications on Results Day. You will find them here on the day results are issued.

Unsure about your results?

If you have a question about your results, please talk to staff at your school or college - they will be able to offer you advice and guidance.

Post Results Services

Your school or college may request one of our 'Post Results Services'. You must give your permission to your school and college before they apply for a post-results service on your behalf.

The following services are available:

- Access to scripts: we provide an electronic copy of your exam papers
- Review of marking: we review our marking to ensure your work was marked accurately in line with the mark scheme
- Clerical re-check: we re-check that all marks have been included and added up correctly.



If your school or college believes that we have made an error in assessing your work, they can request a review on your behalf. If you are a private candidate, you can apply directly to us.

Your grade could go up, go down, or stay the same following a clerical re-check or review of marking. Further information, including deadlines are available here.

Waiting for a university place?

We offer a priority review of marking service for students whose university place is at risk.

It is important you inform your school or college as soon as possible so they can promptly request a review - the deadline for submission is August 25 2022.

Appeals

If, following a review of marking, your school or college believes there is still an error, they can submit an appeal on your behalf.

Your school or college can provide you with further information and support. Private candidates can apply directly to us. It is important you understand the following points:

- Your school/college must request a 'Post-Results Service' and receive a response from us before requesting an appeal
- Your grade could go up, go down, or stay the same following an appeal
- You must give your permission to your school or college before they apply for an appeal on your behalf.



Outcomes of an appeal will be communicated to your school/college within the published times - you can find further information here.

Certificates

We send your certificate to your school or college within 12 weeks of Results Day. Please ask your school/college about when and how you can receive your certificate.

Don't forget to keep this safe. This is evidence of all your hard work!
